Information and Frequently Asked Questions

Corporate Social and Environmental Sustainability

Travel and conferences can generate significant environmental impact. SAFET 2023 acknowledges that much of the impact cannot be removed, but we strive to reduce our footprint where we can. SAFET has taken the following initiatives to reduce your impact on the planet and Indonesia.

Plastic – refillable water bottles have been provided in your cotton tote bag and we have provided filtered water refill stations throughout the conference venue. We encourage the use of the refillable water bottles to reduce the plastic generated from bottled water.

Electronic event – the event signage and advertising is electronic only to avoid the printing of single use signs and advertising. Similarly, the conference program is provided through the Cvent Conference app being used for the SAEFT 2023 program.

Catering – of course we will only plan to cater for the number of registered participants, but we also don't want to you to hungry. This can generate large quantities of uneaten food. Rather than have this go to waste, SAFET has partnered with <u>SOS Food Rescue Operations</u>. All left over food will be provided freely to SOS Food Rescue Operations who will distribute this food to Bali's Street Kids Orphanages. Not only does this ensure that these people have ongoing access to healthy nutritious meals, it also stops the food going into landfill and waste sites needlessly.

Cvent Mobile App

What are the system requirements to access the Cvent App?

The Cvent Events app requires iOS 14 and higher or Android 10 and higher. Please note that Kindle Fire and other devices that use the Amazon App Store are not supported.

How do I download the Cvent App?

Once you have downloaded the app, search for our event, 'SAFET 2023 Impact at Scale for a Sustainable and Resilient Future', and click the arrow to the right to download the event. You will be prompted to enter your name and email address you registered with to receive a verification code by email. Input the verification code to verify your account and enter the event.

Travelling to Bali

Do I require a visa to visit Bali?

SAFET cannot provide any advice in relation to Indonesia's entry or visa requirements. You can explore visa requirements specific to your country at the Indonesian Directorate General of Immigration's website: https://www.imigrasi.go.id/en/

Are there any cultural norms that I should be aware of in Bali?

Indonesia is the world's third largest democracy with the world's largest Muslim population. The Island of Bali is home to Indonesia's Hindu community. Although the Balinese are accustomed to tourists from a range of cultures, the following guidelines are provided to ensure our travel to Bali is culturally sensitive.

Dress and act modestly – beach wear should be worn at the beach only. Shoulders and legs must be covered when visiting temples.

Don't use your left hand to touch or give – this precaution has to do with the left hand being used primarily for hygienic purposes.

Don't use your index finger to point or to beckon – if you need to call attention to someone, beckon him/her to come by extending your hand and, with palm facing down, making a downward wave.

Don't lose your temper – the Balinese believe that raising one's voice is vulgar, being confrontational is offensive, and losing one's temper is simply shameful. Bali locals never show anger or passion openly, and find the Western tendency towards loudness and open emotion somewhat offensive.

Don't touch people's heads – the soul is supposed to reside in one's head, making it off limits for people to touch.

Don't step on offerings (canang sari) in the street – canang sari are offered to the Creator by locals first thing in the morning.

Don't interrupt any religious processions – religious processions in Bali occur fairly regularly, particularly during high holy days like <u>Galungan</u> and Nyepi. These Balinese religious processions take precedence over your trip, no question.

For women, don't enter any temple if you're menstruating.

How can I get from the airport to the hotel?

The local taxi company, BlueBird, provides a reliable and cost-efficient service. They have an app that provides estimates and secure online credit card payment (similar to Uber). The app can be downloaded from the relevant app store.

There are also taxi services provided when you exit the airport, the charges for a taxi from these companies is generally significantly higher that using the Bluebird App.

Approximate costs for a Bluebird taxi are 150K IDR, taxi companies may charge up to 450K IDR for the same journey. All charges are in Indonesian Rupiah (IDR), 100,000.00 IDR is approximately US\$ 6.10.

Conference Name Tag

Please be sure to wear your conference name tag at all times. Those without a name tag will be asked to leave.

What is the dress code for the conference?

The dress code throughout the day and social events is smart casual.

Where do I register when I arrive?

Registration in the Nusantara Foyer will be open from 8am on Tuesday 3rd October along with coffee and tea. The registration desk will be attended all day on Tuesday and until midday on Wednesday 4th October.

How will I know if there have been any changes to the program?

The updated indicative schedule is provided on the <u>SAFET website</u>. The most current version of the program will be provided in the Conference App – Cvent – please refer above for information on accessing the Cvent App.

In the lead-up to the conference, small updates will be made to the program. These changes will be reflected in the Conference App only.

What is the Conference format?

The Conference will be held as two concurrent sessions throughout, with a small number of exceptions, for example the opening and closing sessions. The two rooms will be set up with a stage at the front of the room and theatre style seating (no tables) for 200 people, with the audience entering/exiting from the back of the room only.

Can I photograph or record the sessions?

Please note that all conference sessions will be recorded, including the moderated discussions. Please also note that SAFET will have an official photographer throughout the Conference. These recordings and photographs will be used by SAFET for future online, marketing and promotional activities.

Attendees are not permitted to use any type of camera or recording device at any of the sessions unless written permission has been obtained from the relevant speaker.

Individual Presenters and Special Session Organisers and Presenters

What do I need to do if I am a presenting an individual presentation?

Each session by theme will include several presentations followed by a moderated discussion. The specific format for each session will be an opening by the Moderator(s) who will also introduce each speaker. Presenters will be provided 10 minutes only for their presentation. Please note that the presenter screen will include a countdown clock on screen with an audible sound then the allocated 10 minute time has lapsed.

Once all presentations are complete, the Moderator will take questions from the audience but there will not be questions immediately following each individual presentation.

All Presenters are asked to sit at the front of room to ensure timely transition to and from the stage, thereby minimising lost time between presentations.

The stage will be set up with a lectern and goose-head microphone. One large presentation screen will face the audience. Presenter screens will be placed on the floor in front of the presenter and will show the presenter mode including the countdown clock. There will be 4-5 seats on stage for the moderated discussions.

What do I need to do if I am a special session organizer?

Special Session will run as 45-minute sessions only but have been arranged to run into a break thereby allowing all special sessions to use the time of the breaks if discussions are productive and there is a willingness from the Moderator and the conference attendees at the special session.

Please note that the room format, theatre seating, cannot be changed and that all special session presentations must be with the SAFET organisers by COB 22 September.

What do I need to do if I am a presenting on a panel?

Special Session are being organised and convened by individuals outside of SAFET. These are part of the SAFET Conference but organised separately from the SAFET Conference. Please reach out to your Special Session organiser to understand what is required of you.

What will be available after the conference?

Please note that all conference sessions will be recorded, including the moderated discussions. SAFET will use these recordings in ongoing intersessional online engagement. Information about the

recordings, including when they are made available will be through the SAFET website, newsletter and other online activities such as webinars.
